Deadlines

At the very latest, your form and payment must arrive by the 20th of the month preceding a draw, but obviously you will have your own deadline for the delivery of a gift certificate. Generally, at least 2 weeks' notice would be needed but, if possible, e-mail me further in advance. Given plenty of notice, I might be able to produce an individualised design of certificate for a special occasion. For last-minute Christmas gifts, allow at least 1 week for e-mail despatch, 2 weeks for postal despatch.
